Corinth Police Investigate Abuse to Residents of Group Home

On Monday November 17, 2014, Corinth Police Officers responded to a disturbance in the 3700 Block of Parkwood Drive. While investigating the disturbance, officers determined that this private residence also housed three mentally and physically disabled individuals. Officers on scene discovered deplorable living conditions and later learned that the resident, Dorian Mallory, had neglected, restrained and abused the residents. One of the residents had been kept locked in a closet for an undetermined amount of time. Denton County Mental Health and Mental Retardation and Adult Protective Services personnel were called to the scene to assist and further investigation revealed signs of on-going abuse and neglect.

Assistant Police Chief, Greg Wilkerson stated “The Corinth PD officers and supervisory staff on scene responded on a totally separate matter. They did an outstanding job of recognizing there were other serious issues occurring in this home.” Mallory, who was under contract with “Pat’s Place” (a home health care provider), was being compensated to provide care to the residents. He was arrested at the scene and charged with two felony counts of Injury to a Disabled Individual and one felony count of Unlawful Restraint. He is currently being held at the Denton County Jail on \$400,000.00 in bonds.

According to Assistant Chief Wilkerson, “Private residences are commonly used to house mentally and physically disabled individuals. There are currently no requirements for these types of care facilities to notify the City of their existence so we urge the community to be vigilant. If you reside near one of these facilities and suspect any type of abuse or neglect, please report it immediately to your Police Department.”
