



WHAT'S ON THE BALLOT?

“Whether the City of Corinth Fire Control, Prevention, & Emergency Medical Services District should be continued for ten (10) years and whether the Fire Control, Prevention, and Emergency Medical Services District sales and use tax should be continued for ten (10) years.”



WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR VOTERS?

A **“For”** vote means the continuation of the district and the dedicated $\frac{1}{4}$ cent sales and use tax to fund its operations for 10 years, beginning April 1, 2026.

An **“Against”** vote means not continuing the District and the dedicated $\frac{1}{4}$ cent sales and use tax for 10 years after the District is set to expire on March 31, 2026.

2025 Special Election

Fire Control, Prevention, & Emergency Medical Services District

As part of the November 4th, 2025 election, the City of Corinth will be holding a special election for the renewal of Corinth's Fire Control, Prevention, & Emergency Medical Services District.

About the District

Corinth voters approved creating the District and adopting a dedicated one-fourth of a percent (0.25%) sales and use tax in the November 2020 election for an initial term of five years, beginning April 1st, 2021. The District is administered by the City of Corinth & governed by the District Board & Corinth City Council for funding programs and operations related to fire protection, fire prevention, and emergency medical services.



What Does the District Support?

District funds are utilized by the Lake Cities Fire Department (LCFD) as an alternative funding source for the cost of providing fire, rescue, and emergency medical services throughout the growing Lake Cities region, including Corinth. The dedicated revenue collected by the District has been used for the purchase of essential items such as firefighter training, medical supplies, bunker gear, and rig equipment.



Example: A \$10 purchase is made on a taxable good or service in Corinth. The dedicated $\frac{1}{4}$ cent sales tax is applied and \$0.025 is then collected by the District.

How Does This Impact Corinth?

Eligible goods and services are subject to the District's $\frac{1}{4}$ cent sales tax and it is paid by anyone who makes an applicable purchase in Corinth, including visitors.
